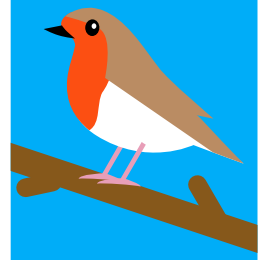
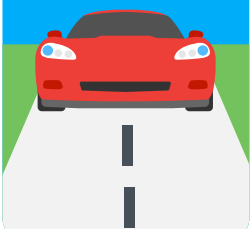
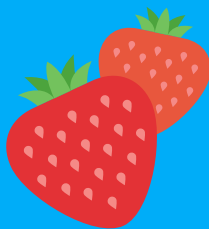
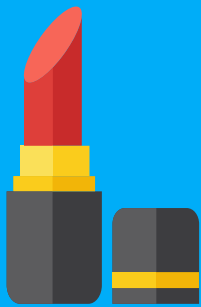
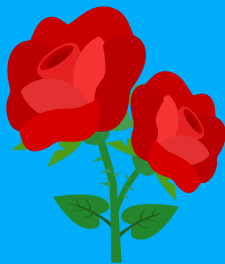
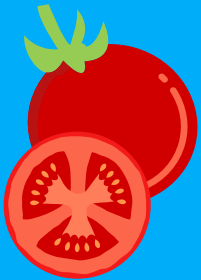
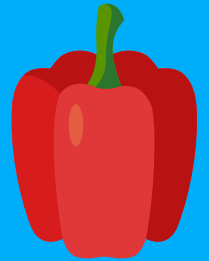
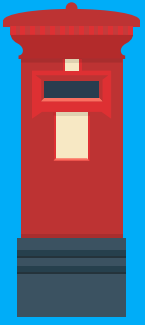
Worksheets	Instructions
Flashcards: Describe this!	Page 1 – Flashcards: red objects. Page 2 – Flashcards: vocab. In pairs or small groups, students take it in turns to describe red objects to each other. Cards can be cut up individually for a memory game activity – turning over one object card followed by a vocab card – if the cards are matching then the student keeps those cards and play continues. If the two cards picked do not match, then the other student/group have their turn. To add an extra element of competition, the teacher could set a time limit for the describe an object task – students describe as many red objects as they can for their partner to guess in 1 minute. Students could also use actions to describe each object silently, to make it more difficult!
What is Red Nose Day? Jigsaw Reading.	Page 3 – Student A reading. Page 4 – Student B reading. Page 5 – Answer sheet. Page 6 – Comprehension questions. Divide the students into pairs and distribute the texts. In pairs, students read the article together. Student A begins reading out loud until they reach a gap. Whenever they reach a gap, they must describe this word to their partner for them to guess and vice versa. Students have 5 missing words to guess. Monitor and check spelling. Comprehension questions to follow once the students have completed the reading – can be done alone or discussed in pairs/groups.
A Good Deed. Write about yours!	Page 7 – Writing task. Students have the opportunity to share their own experiences of helping people, in a good deed kind of way. First describe 'a good deed' and ask for examples, then depending on the level of the student, set a time limit. After the students have finished, encourage them to share their stories with the class either by reading each other's (they could be stuck anonymously around the classroom) or just sharing their experience with their partner.
