**Learning outcomes:** For pupils to practise differentiating you're and your.

## Instructions:



- Print “You’re and your” worksheet page 2.
- Draw someone you know and write your own example sentences on the board for both ‘you’re’ and ‘your’.
- Put pupils into pairs and ask them to draw a picture of their classmate, then write ‘you’re’ and ‘your’ sentences about this person, using what they think they know about their partner.
- Ask the children to read their sentences to their partner. Their partner should tell them if the sentences are true or false.
