## Instructions:

- Review differences between they’re, there and their with the class.
- Ask the pupils to look at the pictures and example sentences in pairs and write a sentence for each word according to the picture.
- Take feedback from the class on example sentences.
- Ask pupils to complete the next exercise, by filling in the blanks. Review answers as a class.
- Ask pupils to write their own sentences about the classroom, their teachers or classmates.

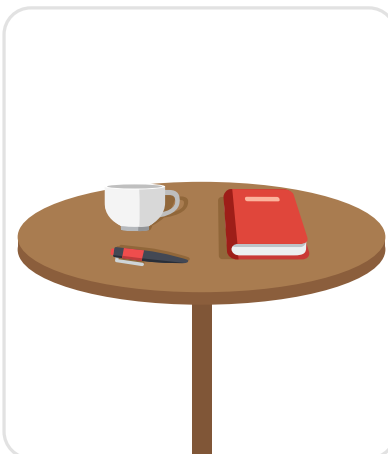
## there
